

The Pacoima Wash is blocking access to nearby San Fernando Recreational Park in the City of San Fernando.




It is crucial to provide green places for people to go outside and engage in an active lifestyle.

It is essential to promote healthy living by providing access to recreational amenities, which will encourage more active life for all age groups.



Metro-Link Rail blocks access to the recreational center and is an eyesore for residents plus the train produces a loud noise

MacArthur Park

Deforest Park




