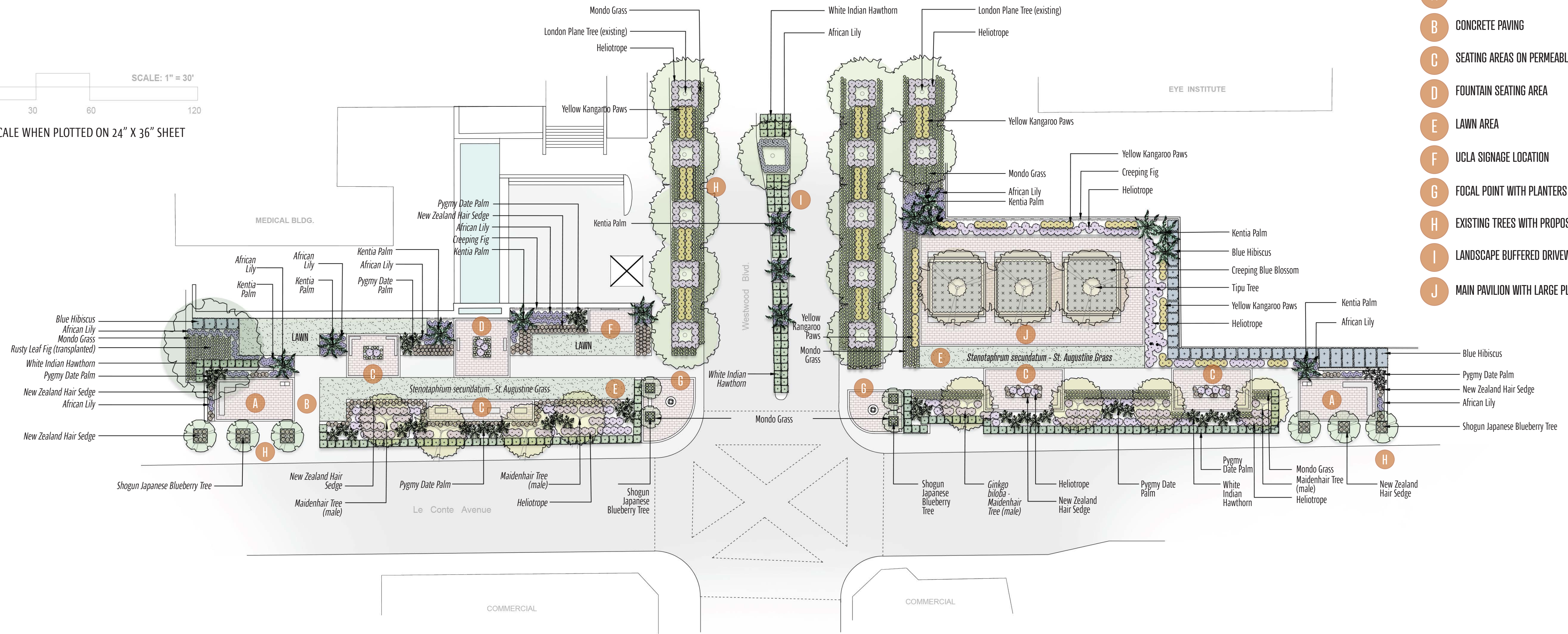
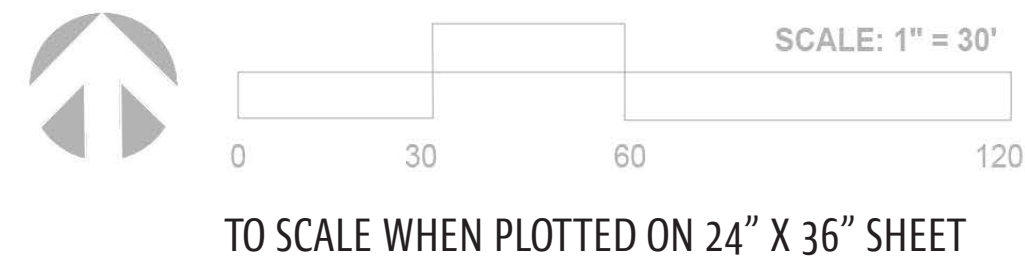
AREA / USE PLAN

LE CONTE AVE. & WESTWOOD BLVD.

This site is located at the front entry of the UCLA campus on Le Conte Ave and Westwood Blvd. with large lawn areas on both sides of the intersection and no distinct plant palette. The re-design concept of this site is based on a suggested grid that was inspired by the brick grid that is exists at the main gathering areas on both ends of the site. The idea is to develop this grid with useful spaces that can create a more notable presence to the entry of the UCLA campus by enhancing the main UCLA signage, creating a strong entry focal point, extending the main gathering areas on both ends of the site, providing ample seating areas with benches, keeping lawn areas. Materials like planters and brick permeable pavers were considered to break up the concrete paving as well as keeping the site consistent with the existing brick patterns that are all around the UCLA campus. The plant palette selection was carefully selected to create yearly interest, landscape buffering, accent and shade areas as well as creating a color palette to bleed blue and gold.
